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## About Intensive Care Coordination with Wraparound Services

Intensive Care Coordination with Wraparound Services (ICCW) is a community—and strength-based planning process that promotes family preservation and independence. This is accomplished through a high level of coordination that is individualized and family-driven. A Wraparound Coordinator facilitates the development of a Child and Family Team to design a treatment plan that is responsive to the family's needs. The team includes service providers and people close to the family.

ICCW provides a seamless interagency approach to unconditionally meet the needs of children and their families.

Collaboration with the Wraparound Community Team is an important part of Wraparound. The Wraparound Community Team includes representatives from key community agencies who assist in identifying resources and improving coordination for the families in Wraparound.

## Eligibility

Children must have a diagnosis that qualifies as a **Serious Emotional Disturbance** and or an **Intellectual/Developmental Disability**, present with complex behavioral health needs, have an identified home and community AND, at least two of the following must be met:

- Multiple system involvement (two or more).
- At risk of or in an out-of-home placement and/or discharge from a state hospital, had two or more inpatient psychiatric hospitalizations, has been released from jail/prison or detention facility, or multiple child welfare placement disruptions.
- Lack of an identified support system.
- Has received other case management type services, and higher intensity is required to meet needs.
- Presenting with complex medical needs and stabilization has not been reached.
- Experiencing multiple suspensions or expulsions at school.
- Displaying significant physical and or emotional distress after a traumatic event.



## Referral Process

The Intensive Care Coordination with Wraparound Services (ICCW) supervisor serves as the primary point of contact for enrolling in ICCW Services. Agency representatives and community members are encouraged to contact the supervisor to make a referral. If you believe a family or child is at risk and could benefit from ICCW, we welcome your referral.
