# Cellular Phones

## SCCCMHA Policies:

Personal Use of Cell Phone 06-002-0005

Access, Use, and Disclosure of Confidential and Protected Health Information (PHI) 08-002-0005

### WHAT CAN I DO?

Can I text Recipient Initials and/or Case Numbers on AGENCY phones?

✓ **YES!** It must be an agency owned device.

Can I capture pictures of recipients on my AGENCY phone?

✓ **YES!** As long as prior written consent was obtained and Mental Health Code guidelines are followed. See Section 330.1724

Can I use my PERSONAL phone to call my supervisor with questions?

✓ **YES!**

Can I use my AGENCY phone to store contact information for recipients/guardians?

✓ **YES!** Only initials and/or case number should be used.

### WHAT CAN'T I DO?

Can I text Recipient Initials and/or Case Numbers on PERSONAL phones?

∅ **NO!** PHI should not be on personal devices.

Can I capture pictures of recipients on my PERSONAL phone?

∅ **NO!** Pictures or recordings of recipients are not allowed on personal devices.

Can I use my PERSONAL phone to call recipients?

∅ **NO!**

Can I use my PERSONAL phone to store contact information for recipients/guardians?

∅ **NO!** Names, initials, and phone numbers should not be stored on personal devices.



Personal phones used to conduct any agency business and any information related to agency business (work emails, making phone calls, or messages to co-workers) become “electronically stored information” (ESI) and are subject to be subpoenaed in lawsuits.

Please note: Complaints can always be filed anonymously.
