I. CALL TO ORDER/AGENDA CHANGES -N. Thomson

Nancy Thomson, Advisory Council Chairperson called the meeting to order at 12:02 p.m.

II. REVIEW/ACCEPT MINUTES - Group

The Advisory Council members accepted the minutes from February 15, 2023 as presented.

III. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR UPDATE -D. Johnson

A. Dementia & Alzheimer's Luncheon

The annual luncheon, initiated by Marsha Haynes, will take place on May 24th 2023. Advocates of the year awards will be presented to community members. Nominations are accepted, and the Council is encouraged to recognize anyone they feel deserving of acknowledgment for their work with the affected community.

B. Behavioral Health and Substance Use Disorder Treatment

A packet of the MDHHS demonstration was provided to Council members. This presentation was given by Ms. Farah Hanley to State Legislature with the purpose of providing an overview of the States system on Behavioral Health and SUD Services, including the funding available across the State, and where it is allotted. Members were encouraged to forward any questions they may have regarding this information to the State in effort to continue communication and feedback from those community members directly affected by these issues.

IV. CMH Updates- K. Gallagher

A. TALKSPACE Update

TALKSPACE rollout has begun, and there has been an increasing interest in the community. We continue to encourage individuals to take advantage of this program. Council members are asked to help spread the word.

B. Children's Advocacy Updates

Assistant Division Director, Heidi Fogarty met last week with Dr. Elizabeth Hertel, the Director HDHHS, regarding the Agency's concerns on Children's Services. Many area children are hospitalized with mental health crises with nowhere to go for treatment, due to the lack of appropriate homes for children in need. Dr. Hertel has stated that she is not in favor of any type of seclusion or restraint treatments, which is problematic with children who are in need of this type of management in homes to remain safe. This perpetuates the lack of homes for children in need. There was discussion regarding personal experiences with these issues, and Council Members are encouraged to voice their concerns to the State Legislator in order to precipitate dialogue which could lead to change.

C. Medicaid Redetermination

The Covid Health Emergency is coming to an end in May. Redetermination packets have started to come out. Over the next year, it will be important for Individuals to respond to outreaches as they occur. MDHHS has a toolkit sent out for media updates, and DHS is pushing out information as well. It has been asked that the Agency do its best to update all Individual contact material to reflect the most accurate information.
