BWAT installing new bus shelters

Blue Water Area Transit is replacing close to half its bus shelters around Port Huron in an effort to replace older ones with newer, more modern structures.

According to a news release, five shelters have been installed, including at stops near Port Huron and Port Huron Northern high schools, Community Mental Health, and the St. Clair County Courthouse downtown. In all, 15 out of 33 bus shelters are being replaced this fall.

The replacement shelters have tempered glass and solar-charged lighting for safety. They were paid for with \$154,000 worth of support from the Federal Transit Administration and the Michigan Department of Transportation's office of public transportation.

"Many of our shelters had met their

"Many of our shelters had met their useful life and were certainly in need of replacement," BWAT General Manager Dave McElroy said in a statement. "... Installation of the shelters is being done by local contractors utilizing local funds. We hope to replace the remaining 18 shelters sometime in 2024 after additional funding has been identified."

Fourteen of the initial shelters were made by the California-based Tolar Manufacturing. The 15th shelter, located on Electric Avenue outside CMH, was made by Brasco Manufacturing, out of Madison Heights.
